

Located in the Riverlands Migratory Bird Sanctuary. Begin your journey at the pond named after a blue winged duck, that is typically the first to arrive on migration! *Trail Level: EASY (grass and gravel, flat)*



Enter the park from S Mason Rd. Explore S on the trail headed towards a playground for 4legged friends. Bark! Explore around trail to the right & the trees and stream on the way. Trail Level: MEDIUM (paved, non-paved, partially inclined)



Head to the forest named after our 35th president and begin on the trail just north of the Walls Dr and Government Drive roundabout. Trail Level: EASY (paved, moderate incline)



Begin on the north western corner of the park and enter the Gaddy Garden trail that is adjacent to the savannah habitat. This trail is a top birding spot in St. Louis City and considered an important bird area. *Trail Level: EASY (mulch/grass, flat)*



Begin by parking on this state's street and enter this 30-acre city park, circa 1851. This bow is on the western half of the park and find an area with lots of shrubs and young trees with a hidden brick path. Trail Level: EASY (paved, stairs, small incline)



Park at the end of an eastern road ending in a carpark by the boardwalk. Begin your hike heading to the right and be on the lookout for birds that may hang out by small bridges! *Trail Level: EASY (paved, flat)*


World Bird Sanctuary 125 Bald Eagle Ridge Rd, Valley Park, 63088



Walk this enchanting path surrounded by birds from around the world. Look for the new LARGE structure & find your mystery bird nearby. *Entry fee \$12 per car* *Trail Level: EASY (paved, small incline)*

Sioux Passage Park T930 Old Jamestown Rd, Florissant, 63034

Follow the road into the park until you make it to a one-way loop drive. Get out and explore the woods around the disc golf course by the gravel parking lot and explore the creek. *Trail Level: EASY (grassy, gravel, flat)*



Head onto Tanglevine Trail and enjoy the storybook along the trail and keep your eyes out for a golden bow on a Black Cherry tree! *Trail Level: EASY (paved, flat)*



Enter the area and find you way to Bluegill Lake on the north end of the park. Hike the loop trail down towards the water and keep a lookout for shiny things. Trail Level: EASY (paved, moderate incline)



Enter the park and start at the top of the lawns. Peer at the artwork and explore a wide field where you might spot a familiar woodland creature! Oh Deer! Trail Level: EASY (grass, minimal incline)
